

Instructions for Circulations of Petitions for the Put-Back Amendment

- 1) The petition sheets must be printed 2-sided. Petitions on the front, amendment text on the back. I recommend printing a “full-size” document with the amendment text so people can examine but that’s optional.
- 2) Before you send me completed sheets, they must be signed in the presence of a notary (almost every public library has one that is free) who will ask you for an ID.
- 3) Always ask someone if they are a registered voter before they sign (NOT PRINT) their name. The address and signature must match voter registration records. Assure them this information will be used for nothing else except getting this amendment on the ballot.
- 4) A petition sheet must only contain signatures from a single election jurisdiction (usually a county). What this means that you cannot mix Cook County voters and Kane County voters on the same sheet. There are, also, 8 cities that are their own election jurisdictions. In those cities, you can only have voters from those cities on a form. That is why those cities have their own forms below. For instance, you CANNOT mix Cook County voters and City of Chicago voters.
